Who may join: Juniors and seniors who have at least a 3.500 cumulative GPA are informed in the fall that they are eligible to be considered for membership. Students then complete an application which is reviewed by the faculty. A Faculty Selection Committee makes the selections based on the four tenets of National Honor Society: character, scholarship, leadership, and service. Students must be enrolled at LHS for at least one semester prior to being considered for membership.
